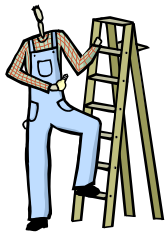


### *NEW Sunday 5:15 pm Mass Needs Musicians and Singers!*

# Thanks to You...

Our medical mission to our sister parish, San Bartolo, was a success!

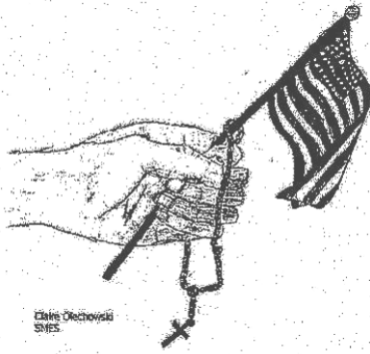
22 parishioners plus a Franciscan Friar traveled to El Salvador June 19 - 25 and ministered to over 1,200 patients in the medical clinics, over 1,000 children in the parish school and many other groups in the 100,000+ member parish.

The delegation distributed your caring and solidarity in the form of:

- Over 1,500 toothbrush and toothpaste kits made with your donations by a Girl Scout earning a Gold Award and Boy Scout earning his Eagle Scout award and the students at RSPS.
- Thousands of children's and adult vitamins
- Thousands of children's and adult's pain relievers/fever reducers, cold remedies, eye drops and ointments
- Financial contributions via the poor boxes to buy antibiotics, anti-parasite medicines and dental supplies such as fluoride
- Screenings at the women's clinic and specialized medicines for chronically ill children and young adults
- Creating and planting a vegetable garden at the school to be used as a science learning tool and food source
- Donated medical supplies (not usable at the clinic) went to Divina Providencia - a Carmelite hospice or San Bartolo hospital

Unfortunately four of our suitcases with some of the donated medicines were seized by customs in El Salvador and are still there. We are working with Salvadoran and USA officials and hopefully they will be released soon. Please pray for quick resolution so the medications can be used at the parish clinic.
